RE: New Handling Commissions Effective May 1, 2024

#### Good afternoon,

The BCMB's Board of Directors had its quarterly meeting on April 24, 2024, and approved several decisions, including a change to the handling commissions.

#### The Decision

The BCMB's Board of Directors approved an 18.6% decrease to the average handling commission based on calculations in the 2023 Annual Update Report (AUR). The new handling commissions are effective May 1, 2024, to April 30, 2025. The new handling commissions can be found on pages 5-6 in the <a href="Handling Commission By-law">Handling Commission By-law</a> on the BCMB website. The <a href="2023 Annual Update Report">2023 Annual Update Report</a> is also available on the BCMB website.

#### The Process

Handling commissions are reviewed annually through a process described within the <u>Handling Commission By-law</u>.

Section 13.5 of the Handling Commission By-law indicates that should the average handling commissions currently in effect "differ in amount by more than +/- 0.3 of 1%, **the Board shall approve** the updated Handling Commissions effective as of May 1." This process was completed at the April 24, 2024, board meeting.

The BCMB recognizes that the 18.6% decrease is a considerable decline as compared to last year's 22.8% increase to the average handling commission. Upon receiving the last AUR in November of 2023, the BCMB Board recognized that the volatility of handling commissions over the past four years is inconsistent with good regulation and established a committee to investigate the causes of this volatility.

## Addressing Handling Commission Volatility

The main cause of fluctuation in handling commissions was identified as the type of labor index utilized. Going forward, the BCMB Board adopted the application of the Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI) quarterly forecast. The use of the Alberta CPI quarterly forecast was determined to meet the principles of transparency, simplicity, credibility, reliability, stability, and reasonability.

The Alberta CPI will be applied within the 2024 Annual Update Report process, applicable to handling commissions effective May 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026.
